Dear Principal Leask,

I am writing to you as a representative of LGB Alliance Australia, an organisation dedicated to advocating for the rights and well-being of same-sex attracted individuals.

It is with deep concern that we read a student at your school was banned from bringing her girlfriend to the Year 12 formal. The LGB community experience discrimination because of their sexual orientation on a daily basis. It is deeply troubling to witness such discrimination present in an educational setting where every student should have the opportunity to flourish. As students were allowed to bring opposite-sex partners to the formal, that same-sex couples were banned is a blatant display of discrimination against certain students. Your duty should be to care for, support and encourage all students, as the stewards of their education.

Research indicates that educational establishments should not perpetuate this kind of overt discrimination, as it can profoundly impact a student's mental health. Such discrimination can lead to increased rates of depression and anxiety, diminished self-esteem and self-worth, decreased academic performance, and social isolation.

We urge you to reflect upon the values and principles that your educational institution upholds and to ensure that all students, regardless of their sexual orientation, are treated with fairness, dignity, and respect. We are willing to engage in a constructive dialogue with you to address this matter and collaborate on ways to foster a more supportive environment at your school.
